She lives in Odorkor, Accra and teaches at a public school at Mataheko, earning a little bit over GHc 11,000 per annum


Ama is extremely dedicated and has been teaching for over a decade, trying as much as she can to make a positive impact

The current state makes it extremely difficult for her to do her continuous learning to improve herself. This is the gap our solution intends to bridge.









Data

Results for Teachers' Licensure Exams 2023





Our solution is to develop a self-paced online training platform for teachers, based on the curriculum of the Ghana Education Service.



What's Next?


More research on user pain points to finetune the important features required by users
